Preschool Program

The focus of the preschool program is to tailor learning to meet individual children's needs and interests. We provide children with opportunities to engage in high quality learning experiences, in accordance with the Early Years Learning Framework. The program enables educators to engage children in learning through play, by promoting each child's ability and using a project-based approach which reflects the interests of children. We analyse each child's learning and development, and support them to reach their developmental goals. The preschool program is based upon the children's involvement in a variety of planned and spontaneous play based activities and experiences that build on their needs and interests. Children are free to choose the areas of interest in which they participate, both indoors and outdoors.

Philosophy

Our Statement

St Johns Park Preschool is situated on the lands of the Cabrogal People of the Dharug Nation whom are a part of our wider community. We pay respect to the Elders past, present and emerging.

St Johns Park Public School Preschool is a safe, supportive and inclusive environment for early learning. The preschool is an integral part of the whole school community where the cultural diversity of our families is valued and celebrated.

We provide an engaging learning environment where each child can develop a strong sense of identity, wellbeing and connectedness; be confident and involved learners and effective communicators.

We believe every child is unique and every child brings a range of experiences, capabilities and interests to the setting. As educators we respect the individuality of children and believe that children can be successful, competent and capable learners. We value our role in the growth and development of their skills, curiosity, creativity and independence to become lifelong learners, risk takers and active and informed citizens who will positively contribute to society.

Our Preschool offers a play-based curriculum that supports the wellbeing and development of the whole child; socially, emotionally, physically and intellectually. Opportunities to make choices and decisions, to influence events and to have an impact on their world is essential. Play provides experiences, both planned and spontaneous, for children to learn as they discover, create, improvise and imagine. By interacting with other children and educators, they build relationships, test ideas, challenge each other's thinking, build on prior knowledge and develop resilience.



We are committed to create inclusive learning environments and adopt flexible and informed practices, including making reasonable adjustments to optimise access, participation and engagement in learning. (EYLF Principle 3, 2022)

The early childhood years should be about a joyful exploration of the world as the children see it.

We believe that children's learning is enhanced when children, educators and families work collaboratively to provide a quality foundation to learning and education, and when home school continuity of learning is promoted. We are committed to developing and promoting respectful, trusting and responsive relationships with families, acknowledging and celebrating their diversity and cultural heritage.

We believe that as educators we are lifelong learners. Reflective practice and ongoing professional learning are paramount to ensuring a quality learning environment for all children to grow and develop. Continuity of learning and transitions for each child are supported through curriculum planning .

At St Johns Park Public School Preschool we provide children with meaningful experiences both in the indoor and outdoor environments. The development of an awareness and responsibility to respect the natural environment and sustainable practices, is embedded in our program.

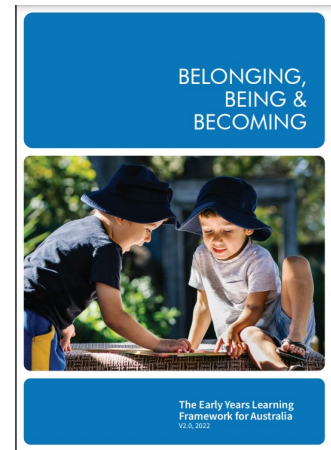

Early Years Learning Framework

The preschool program is guided by the The Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) and is underpinned by 5 learning outcomes:

- Children have a strong sense of identity.
- Children are connected with and contribute to their world.
- Children have a strong sense of wellbeing.
- Children are confident and involved learners.
- Children are effective communicators.



Belonging acknowledges children’s interdependence with others and the basis of these relationships in defining their identity. Belonging shapes who children are and who they can become.

Being recognises the significance of the here and now in children’s lives. It understands the importance of children just ‘being’ in the now to play, learn and enjoy themselves.

Becoming reflects the process of rapid and significant change that occurs in the early years as young children learn and grow.

What Your Child Will Need To Wear and Bring To Preschool

- Children should be dressed in comfortable ‘play clothes’. The Cancer Council NSW recommends that when playing outside children should wear dresses, t-shirts or shirts **with sleeves** to cover shoulders and if possible a collar. There is no specific uniform for preschool.
- For safety reasons, children should wear closed comfortable shoes such as joggers to preschool as these are best for play activities such as riding bikes, running and general play.
- A bag large enough to hold all they need each day and that they can close independently.
- A Sunsafe Hat
- A change of clothing, including underwear, to be kept in the child’s bag.
- Healthy packed lunch, a snack and a refillable bottle filled with water.
