A Sustainability Initiative - Lids4Kids

The Sustainability Committee will be initiating a worthy cause for Lids4Kids into our school's recycling program. This program is run by a charity called Envision, who use plastic bottle lids to make prosthetic limbs for underprivileged, disabled children using 3D printing technology. We are asking families to recycle plastic from bottle tops, which will benefit the environment. Bottle caps are fully recyclable, but are not being recycled. They get sent to landfill, or fall through machinery, and, if attached to a bottle, can explode and force expensive re-packing issues. Please do not throw away those plastic lids from milk bottles and other bottles such as juice bottles.

Library News

2019 Book Week Competitions

Book Week preparations are in full swing in the school library. The theme of Book Week this year is 'Reading is My Secret Power'. Students are involved in a variety of activities based on the Children's Book Council of Australia's Short Listed Books. The student's work is linked to Literacy, Numeracy, the Creative Arts and problem solving. Parents are invited to come to the library to view the Book Week display.

Our Preschoolers are exploring and identifying the bold and bright colours of their world, while reading 'Red House, Blue House, Green House, Tree House!' by Jane Godwin. Kindergarten are using their knowledge of the Elements of Art to create colourful polar bears based on the book 'Rainbow Bear' by Stephen Michael King. Year One are learning about acceptance and resilience and are creating vivid stink bugs, while enjoying 'Here comes Stinkbug!' by Tohby Riddle. Year Two are enjoying the story 'The Singing Seal' by Merv Lamington, which is based on a real story. Students are creating flamboyant, operatic seals focusing on believing in yourself. Year Three are budding entomologists discovering the world of insects, creating clues and three-dimensional bugs for the book 'Heads and Tails, Insects' by John Canty. Year Four are respectfully acknowledging the past and the need to make things right. The book 'Sorry Day', by Coral Vass retells the story of that momentous day. Year Five are reading 'Cicada' by Shaun Tan, researching how cicadas have featured in literature and discovering what cicadas symbolise. The students are creating detailed sketches and investigating the concepts of hope, resurrection and regeneration. Year Six students, using the text 'Make Believe' which has been especially created by the National Gallery of Victoria, are examining the life and work of M.C Escher and his passion for creating optical illusions that play tricks on our minds. Students are designing their own tessellations and experimenting with Tagxedo Creator. 3/6L is reading 'Girl on Wire' by Lucy Estela, which reflects on the universal concepts of courage and confidence. Students are using collage to represent the uplifting allegory of a young girl struggling to build her self-esteem. K-4D and K-5C are enjoying 'The Dress-Up Box' by Patrick Guest which is a story about childhood, belonging and the power of imagination. The students are constructing individual masks from boxes.

We look forward to seeing you in the library during Book Week.

School Banking

Just a reminder that School Banking is every Tuesday mornings, located outside the office.


A few points for parents & students to take note regarding School Banking, there has been some confusion.

- If your child doesn't have a Youth Saver account then you need to open up one at
 the Commonwealth Bank, just bring your child's birth Certificate and the branch can
 open an account for your child. Just bring in the account details to us and we can
 give them a banking wallet and when they bank with the school for the first time we
 can give them a student number which is unique to them and that's what they will
 use to bank with us every week.
- Tokens cannot be shared amongst siblings or friends, each deposit made is recorded in the bank's system for each student;
- 10 tokens and they can claim prizes offered by the bank, token slips are available at the banking tables
- If tokens don't match what you think you may have, you can always ask us to check
 in the system for you. We do sometimes forget to put in a token, but the system
 records it so just because you didn't get a token in your banking wallet doesn't mean
 you didn't earn a token for that banking week;
- Prized claimed can only be with the present Term or past Terms, ie we are in Term 3
 so you can claim any prizes from Term 1 to 3 BUT you cannot claim prizes in Term 4.

We hope we have clarified common questions asked by parents & students. Hope you see you all every Tuesday.


