#### Notes

As a school we are constantly reflecting on and reviewing our procedures.

To streamline our procedures relating to student absences, as of Monday, 16th March, 2020 we ask families to submit to the School Office, rather than the class teacher, any explanations and/or medical certificates related to student absences. Parents can continue emailing the school and using the School app to submit absent notes.

Permission to Publish notes will no longer be discussed and completed upon enrolment. The permission to publish is included in the Enrolment Form. If circumstances change and parents wish to change the status of this permission, we ask that the School Office is contacted and arrangements for this change to occur can be organised.

We thank families for their support in these matters.

#### **School Photographs**

Class photographs and individual portraits, as well as sibling/family photographs, will be taken on Thursday, 19th March, 2020. Every student, Kindergarten to Year 6, was given an individually labelled prepay envelope. A limited number of extra envelopes are available. Sibling/family envelopes are available from the School Office.

# All orders must be submitted to the School Office before 9.10am on Thursday, 19th March.

The School office will be closed 8.30-8.45am so that the staff photograph can be taken. We ask students and parents, who have photo orders to submit, to wait outside the School Office until the School Administrative Staff return to the office.

A reminder that each student will be photographed individually and as part of the class photograph whether or not an order is placed. Parents wishing for their child not to be photographed and included in other children's photograph packages must inform the school in writing by Tuesday, 17th March, 2020.

We ask that all students wear their full Summer school uniform which includes white socks and black shoes. Sports day for students in Kindergarten to Year 2 will be postponed. Teachers of these classes will notify parents of the rescheduled day for sport for this week.

#### **Life Education Program**

Students in Preschool to Year 6 will be participating in an interactive visit from Life Education. The visit will take place in the Life Education Classroom which will be located on the school grounds - Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> March to Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> April, 2020. Each class will attend <u>one</u> lesson of 60 or 90 minutes, accompanied by their class teacher, with all participating students receiving a workbook to support the lesson.

#### **Gymnastics Program**

In Term 2, students in Kindergarten & Year 2 will participate in weekly Gymnastics lessons. Gymnastics is a part of our PDHPE syllabus and therefore it is expected that all students will participate.

Trained expert teachers, being supervised with the class teacher, will deliver a sequence of 8 lessons over the term. This will give our students greater access to the required 2 hours of physical activity at school each week and develop movement skills.

Students in Years 4 and 6 will participate in the program in Term 3.

#### **Contact Details**

Families are reminded to notify the School Office if any contact details have changed. It is extremely important that contact details, especially telephone numbers, of parents/caregivers and emergency contacts are updated if they have changed.

If the change of details is related to a change of address, parents are required to complete a form available from the School Office and supply a copy of documentation with the new address.

# **School Photographs**

#### Students are asked to wear full summer school uniform.

Each student has received an individual pre-payment order form with their name and class printed on it with details of the available packages and pre-payment instructions.

Follow these steps to order:

- Tick the box for the package being ordered.
- Tick the box for payment method. You may pay by cash, money order or credit card (online orders only).
- If paying by cash, please enclose the correct payment as change is not available.
- Credit card payments can only be processed online by going to www.theschoolphotographer.com.au.
   Record the receipt number in the space provided on the envelope and return the envelope to the School Office.
- Each student has received an individual envelope with their name and class printed on it. This is the envelope that should be returned to the School Office **before Thursday, 19th March, 2020**. <u>If combining payments for more than one child please complete the 'combined payments' box on the envelope.</u>

Parents wishing to have their children photographed together, should collect a family/sibling envelope from the School Office.

Each student will be photographed individually and as part of the class photograph whether or not an order is placed. Parents wishing for their child <u>not</u> to be photographed and included in other children's photograph packages must inform the school in writing by Tuesday, 17th March, 2020.

## **Library Update**

#### 2020 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge

Once again, our school will be participating in the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge. The challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure, while enabling students to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge for students to read more widely and more often.

Students must read from a prescribed list. Students in K-2 may have the books read to them.

PRC books are located on special shelves in our library, to make them easy to locate. Inside the cover of each book, there is a code, which should be recorded in a PRC Reading Log and entered online at <a href="https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html">https://online.det.nsw.edu.au/prc/home.html</a>

- ♦ K-2 students must read 30 books from the 2020 PRC List
- ♦ Years 3-6 must read 20 books from the 2020 PRC List

Parents must be aware that it is their responsibility to ensure that reading records are entered onto the PRC website, using the student's DET username and password. Teacher librarians are unable to enter reading records online, due to the large number of students participating. If you do not have internet access, students can enter their reading online in the library before school or at lunchtime, but it is important that they keep an accurate paper record on their Reading Log. Online registration opened on **Monday**, **2**<sup>nd</sup> **March**, **2020**. All Student Reading Records must be submitted online by **Friday**, **28th August**, **2020**.

Information regarding student usernames can be provided by the class teacher or the Teacher Librarians. These usernames and passwords are the same ones that students use when logging on to computers and devices at school. Parents who need assistance should visit the library before 9am in the morning.



## **Bullying. No Way!**



On Friday, 20th March, 2020 our school will be taking part in **National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence (NDA)**. It is an important day to mark Australian school communities standing together against bullying and violence. Our school community is asked to share their commitment to say **Bullying**. **No Way!** and put our anti-bullying programs in the spotlight.

#### **Definition of Bullying**

The national definition of bullying for Australian schools says:

Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders. Single incidents and conflict or fights between equals, whether in person or online, are not defined as bullying.

# Preschool News ...

#### What has been happening in Preschool?

Dinosaurs are a big interest of the children in preschool, both in pink and purple group. Through interacting and observing the children's play, the children were manipulating natural materials in the environment to represent their ideas; rocks in the ground were dinosaur eggs. From this observation the children made dinosaur eggs using resources in the preschool, we found moulds that resembled eggs and froze them to incorporate them into our play. The children displayed many dispositions of learning such as problem solving and trial and error as they collaborated to work out how to get the eggs out of the moulds and how to release the dinosaurs. Pulling, banging the mould on the edge of the tray and using warm water were just some of the methods used. We extended on this learning by talking about fossils and bones and following up with a dinosaur skeleton craft.















#### **Preschool Clothing**

Remember to always pack a **hat** and **spare set of clothes** for your child. Sometimes clothing can get wet or dirty when experimenting and exploring the environment. Messy play helps children to understand how things feel, such as textures and temperatures. They also learn about body awareness and spacial awareness. Children can develop many great pre-writing skills with messy play through pouring, scooping, and grasping while perfecting hand-eye coordination skills. It is also a great way for children to engage in pretend play.
